## East Cowton Village Hall Poster HELP US ALL TO STAY FREE OF COVID-19

You must not enter this Hall if you or anyone in your household has COVID-19 symptoms.

If you feel unwell at the Hall, you should inform the organiser immediately and return home.

Do Not Become Complacent - Maintain 2 metres social distancing as far as possible; includes waiting at the entrance, taking turns to use confined spaces such as doorways, corridors and toilet areas, stopping to talk. Standing or sitting next to someone is lower risk than opposite them.

**Use the hand sanitiser provided** on entering and leaving the premises. Clean your hands often. There is hot running water, soap and paper towels provided in the toilets, please use it.

Avoid touching your face, nose, or eyes. Clean your hands if you do.

"Catch it, Bin it, Kill it". Tissues should be disposed of into one of the rubbish bags provided. Then wash your hands.

**Do not assume that surfaces are clean.** The hall is cleaned between user groups but you should ensure we maintain the cleanliness of frequently used surfaces.

Keep the Hall well ventilated.

Wash your hands when you get home and consider washing clothes to reduce risk of transmission.

**If you develop COVID-19 symptoms** within 7 days of visiting these premises alert the NHS Test and Trace service. Alert the Hall Committee and alert the organiser of the activity you attended.

The Kitchen is not to be used until further notice. Bring your own food or drink if required.

The small hall/ meeting room is only to be used for the Post Office and storage of used chairs.

**Fabric chairs** that have been used may be stacked in the meeting room and isolated for 3 days. Fresh chairs may be taken from the stage.

Folding tables should be cleaned before putting away in the cupboard.

As we open the hall in July after the long shut-down, we can only arrange one booking per day so we can organise cleaning of the hall after each event. It's important that we maintain our guard against this very dangerous Covid-19 virus. It is still infecting many people in the UK.
